Case study: Indonesia

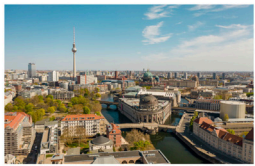
Figure 1. Location of Indonesia.

However like all major cities, Berlin has major conflicts that provoke much debate among its residents.

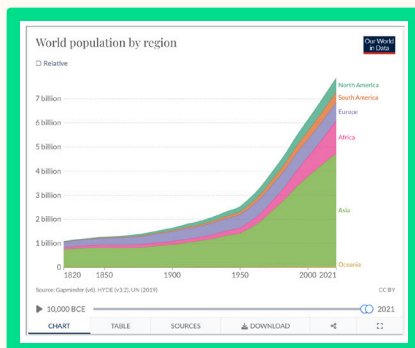
