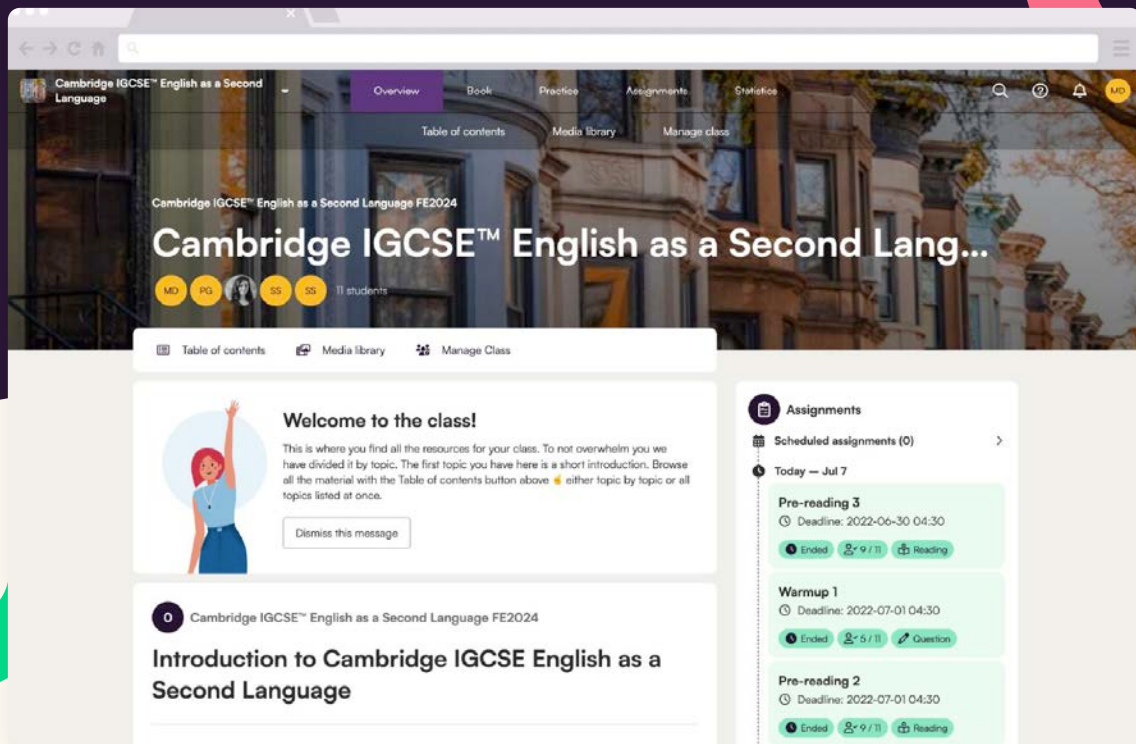

Our IGCSE ESL subject supports the full Cambridge syllabus (0510/0511/0991/0993) for the first examination from 2024.



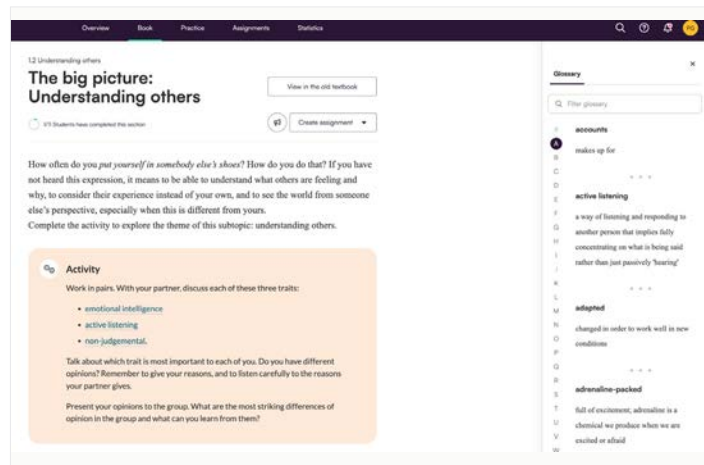

Interactive Glossary

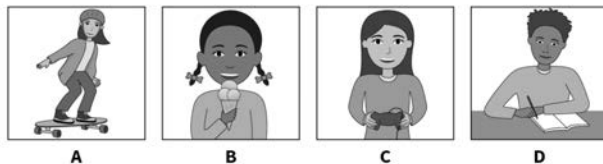
Every time a student wants to see the meaning of a specific word, they can pop open the Glossary feature to view the definition.

1. What did the girl spend the afternoon doing?

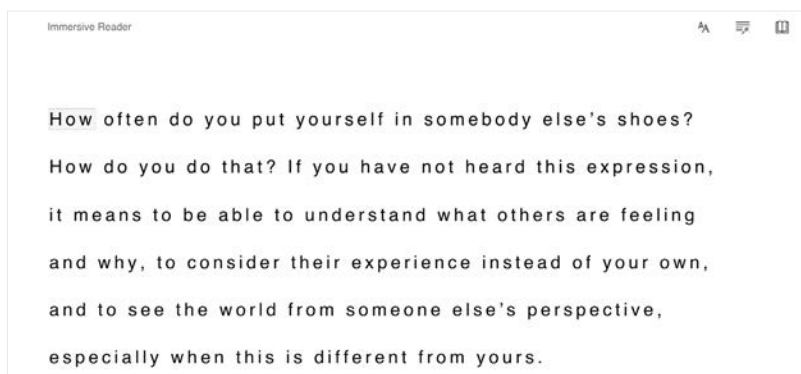


Visual Resources

This resource offers a plethora of visual resources like images, interactives, and videos to support students in learning the English language.

Immersive Reader

The reader tool allows students to read and listen to the text at the same time, an excellent feature for language development. They can also change the visualisation of the text, and translate into another language if needed.



Study Skills Boxes

1 Reading Tips

 Study skills

- > Read all the Exercise 1: Note making questions first.
- > Read the text through once carefully. Try to understand the general meaning of what has been written.
- > Briefly reread the questions again. Then scan through the text to find the correct information for each one.
- > Return to the text and repeat this process until you have answered all the questions.

2 Listening Tips

 Study skills

- > Read all the Exercise 1: Multiple choice questions first.
- > Listen to the audio recording once without pausing it. Try to understand the general meaning of what is being said.
- > Listen to the audio recording a second time. Pause the recording when you find the answer to a question. Input your answer.
- > Before you restart the audio recording, reread the next question.

Vocabulary Box

Similar to the study skills box, the vocabulary box enhances your students' range of vocabulary. The beneficial part is that the words in each box are directly related to the current subtopic and used several times, so by the end of a subtopic, students will have learned and practised most of the vocabulary. The benefit can be seen in the writing and speaking skills, which is always more challenging for teachers to improve in students' performance.
